THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

Registration of Athletes & Horses

Athletes are entered by the Organising Committee through their NF. (Art. 113 General Regulations will apply) All entries must include first name, last name and FEI ID of rider as well as full name and FEI ID of the horse.

All athletes and horses participating in any International competition must be registered with the FEI. Any athlete and/or horse who is not registered with the FEI (at the start of the event) shall be automatically disqualified.

STABLES

Upon arrival each horse will be issued with an identification number which **must be worn at all times.** (FEI eventing rules 535.1)

There will be an examination of ALL horses on arrival at VICTORIA PARK / PAKAPAKANTHI prior to entry to stables. For arrival times and arrangements see provisional timetable.

Size of boxes: 3.5m x 3.5m (minimum 3m x 3m)

Push bikes must not be ridden in the stable areas or between the grandstand and the main arena.

Whilst every effort is made to accommodate your request to be 'stabled next to', it is not always possible due to 5* limited space in the 5* restricted area.

DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH OR TIED UP IN THE STABLES, CAMPING AND COMPETITION AREAS. Dogs may be exercised in the off-leash area at the southern end of the park. Pick up after your dog.

FEI General Regulations Article 109.13: Violation of this rule will incur a fine of \$150 per offence, and in the case of a repeated offence, may lead to exclusion from the venue.

ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

ALLOCATED TICKETS (accreditation)

Two systems of accreditation will be operating as all three days of the 5* competition will be ticketed.

Competition Accreditation (wristbands) will be allocated as detailed below.

General Admission tickets (wristbands) will be required for access to the Main Arena on Friday, Saturday and Sunday; and to all three parks on Cross Country Day.

Complimentary General Admission Wristbands will be allocated to each competitor as follows:

Rider	1
Groom	1 per athlete (rider)
Partner	0
Horse Owners	2 as per FEI passport

Extra passes may be purchased from the Secretary's office for \$50 each.

THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO

EXTREME HOT WEATHER:

Adelaide can experience extremely hot weather - please check the forecast and make the necessary arrangements such as bringing fans for your stables if the weather is forecast to be warm.

CAMP SITE

PLEASE NOTE: This year, the campsite is situated on the bitumen pad in the middle of Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi (west of the Main Arena). Pegging of annexes is not possible into bitumen. Please bring weights to weigh your annexes down.

Entrance to the campsite/stable area is off Wakefield Road.

Powered camping facilities are available in Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi. There will be a compound erected for trucks and caravans. Shower/toilet facilities will be on site. Truck identification numbers will be allocated and campers must park at the corresponding campsite. Fines will be issued to those who do not park in their allocated space. Only those vehicles displaying the Camp Site permit will be granted access to this area. Additional vehicles may be parked in the volunteers car park off Fullarton Road

Competitors are advised that the campsite will be audited by officers of Workplace Services who will be inspecting all electrical cables and appliances to ensure that they carry a valid safety tag. Any qualified electrician can test and tag your cables and appliances.

We recommend you ensure your cables and appliances are tested and tagged prior to the event, otherwise they will be removed.

AEF is required by Workplace Services to implement this policy.

The total facilities fee including camping fee at Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi will be **\$350** per vehicle for Tuesday - Sunday.

Riders not camping onsite must pay a **\$50** amenities fee.

Eating outlets will be supplied around the Main Arena in Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi. There are also many cafes in the surrounding areas of Norwood Parade and East End Adelaide.

The Equilume Owners & Riders Tent will be open to all riders, owners and grooms during the event. This marquee will be located adjacent the warm up arena and will have bar and food facilities within.





IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

In the unlikely case of an emergency, see emergency evacuation map which is posted in the Secretary's office as well as all notice boards in the stable area and campground areas.

ADVERTISING & PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES & HORSES

The athletes are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with Article 541 of the FEI Rules for Eventing. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on athletes and horse complies with these Articles.

BIOSECURITY

Movement of horses

There are currently no movement requirements or certification required for horses moving from interstate into SA. However, **please be advised that we are a HENDRA event**. Livestock (including horses) affected or suspected of being affected with a notifiable disease may not enter the State unless authorised by the SA Chief Inspector of Stock.

NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Hendra Vaccination

Riders are required to advise the Hendra vaccination status of their horses on their entry form. The organising committee reserves the right to not accept entries where horses from Hendra affected areas* are not vaccinated.

Hay & Fodder:

There is to be no hay brought into SA from interstate. If you need to bring in your own hay then this will need to be inspected on arrival at the AEF venue by Biosecurity SA. This inspection WILL INCURR A FEE of \$159.

Hay brought into SA from interstate must be securely wrapped upon arrival, separated by one metre from other plant materials, and subjected to a Direct Inspection by a Biosecurity SA Officer before being released. These checks cannot be carried out at the border. Charges will apply.

It is highly recommended that you purchase hay through Oliver's to be delivered to the AEF on your arrival.

1. Medical Information Form for Armbands

Declaration of medical condition

Athletes with medical conditions that may be relevant in the case of a medical emergency are responsible, at every Event when riding, for wearing a medical data carrier* from a system provider able to communicate information at least in English. Alternatively (and at the minimum) a medical armband of good quality can be used. Athletes who chose to wear an armband should download and fill the form available for this purpose on the FEI's website <http://www.fei.org/fei/your-role/officials/eventing/forms>.

2. Insurances and National Requirements

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the FEI Event Organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses at or in connection with an FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability. The FEI and the Organiser will **NOT** be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

3. Protests/Appeals

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

4. Disputes

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

5. Event's Organisation (Art. 109 - 110)

The OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. All modifications made to the schedule must have the approval of the FEI Secretary General.

STEWARDING

It is the rider's responsibility to be aware of the FEI rules under which the event is being run. If riders are uncertain about any rules, such as if the equipment/gear they are using is approved, then they should approach the Stewarding Team.

HUMAN ANTI- DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested

by the FEI as outlined in article 22.3 of the FEI's Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA). The ADRHA rules are published on the FEI's website at <http://fei.org/content/anti-doping-rules>.

VETERINARY MATTERS

Veterinary Regulations (VRs), 14th edition, updates effective 1st January 2019

Passports

Passport Requirement: **General Regulations Article 137**

For all Horses FEI Passports/FEI Recognition cards issues, please address to your National Federation.

All horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards - for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI, are compulsory for FEI Events, with the exception of CNs and CIMs as outline below

Event's Category	FEI Passport and / or Recognition Card
National Events (CN)	Not compulsory
CCI- short/long 2* / 3*	Not compulsory for Horses from the host Nation – Compulsory for Horses from the invited Nations
CCI - long 4* / 5* CCI - short 4* CHs/Games of all levels	Compulsory

Examination on Arrival

FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1031

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

Temperature Information-

FEI Veterinay Regulations Article 1031

Prior to arrival ensure an FEI Equine Health Self-Certification form has been completed in the FEI HorseApp for each Horse entering the FEI Stables Area and that the Horse's rectal temperature has been recorded in the FEI HorseApp twice daily for **3 days prior to the first horse arriving** at the event (ie 3 days prior to Tuesday April 18th). Other methods of evaluating the Horse's body temperature must be FEI approved.

As horses will be arriving at the AEF from Tuesday, all competitors will be required to start recording their horses temperature and entering it into the FEI HorseApp from Saturday 15 April.

Horse Inspections

FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1034-1042

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

Limb Sensitivity Protocol

FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1048-1053

All Horses are subject to Examination under the Protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the Period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event.

Horses may be selected for Examination under the Protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the Examination or are subject to immediate Disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Programme (EADCMP)

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter V

Sampling

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures

Veterinary Treatment and Designated Treatment Areas at FEI Events

FEI List of Equine Prohibited Substances since 5th April 2010 which now contains an exact list of substances that are prohibited under FEI rules. See www.feicleansport.org.

Permission to undertake treatments and the location where they take place, is under the control and the authority of the FEI Veterinary Officials present.

Treatment generally must take place in allocated designated treatment areas for this purpose unless by special agreement with FEI Veterinary Officials. The only exception to this is a clear emergency, when a retrospective ETUE may be considered, but may not be authorized in all cases.

Equine Therapeutic Use Exemption (ETUE) Form 2 - Declaration for administration of altrenogest to mares competing in FEI competitions. This must be submitted before the start of the event. No Ground Jury countersignature is needed.

Treatment may take place in own stables.

Medication Form 3 - Authorization for the use of Medication not on the list of Prohibited Substances (i.e. rehydration fluids and antibiotics). This form does not need to be countersigned by the President of the Ground Jury.

Treatment may be required in the designated treatment areas, but in the case of some treatments i.e. intravenous fluids, or lack of sufficient treatment areas, agreement may be made for this to be undertaken in own stables.

Agreed treatment areas are required for the supervised activities of Physical Therapists, but such areas for this activity may be the horses own stable.

SUPPORTIVE THERAPIES

FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1064, 1065, 1066 and 1067

An agreed treatment area and supervision is not required for simple treatments such as icing, water, cold laser, "magnetic therapies", "heated blankets" etc.

Supervision of all such treatments by FEI Officials may take place directly or by requesting to see a copy of the relevant authorization. No treatments may take place without coming under such control and authority except in the case of a clear emergency, when a retrospective authority may be considered, but may not be issued in all cases.

Alternative Therapy Practitioners

Only those listed with the FEI will gain access to the 5* stables – a list will be with the Stable manager, Veterinarians and the Secretary. Otherwise treatment to take place outside the 5* stable area.
