Wednesday

Riders are invited to attend a Civic Function at the Adelaide Town Hall on Wednesday 17 April 5:00pm - 6:30pm. This function hosted by the Lord Mayor of Adelaide will be compulsory for all 5* and 4* competitors.

Saturday

The Riders Party returns in 2024 bigger than ever, a theme will be released after entries close with prizes for the 'best dressed' up for grabs, cash bar, street food and live music. Located in the VIP Lounge on Saturday evening. Each Rider receives 2 x complimentary tickets. Additional tickets can be purchased at the Secretary's Office or online. This event is closed to the General Public.

During each day, the AEF will feature a range of activities in the Main Arena and Marketplace that complement the FEI Eventing Competitions.

STABLES

Upon arrival each horse will be issued with an identification number which **must be worn at all times.** (FEI eventing rules 535.1)

There will be an examination of ALL horses on arrival at VICTORIA PARK / PAKAPAKANTHI prior to entry to stables. For arrival times and arrangements see the provisional timetable.

Size of boxes: 3.5m x 3.5m (minimum 3m x 3m)

Push bikes must not be ridden in the stable areas or between the grandstand and the main arena.

Whilst every effort is made to accommodate your request to be 'stabled next to', it is not always possible due to limited space in the 5* stables & restricted area. If you do not request your stabling location needs *PRIOR* to the event the Stable Manager cannot guarantee your needs will be met.

DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH OR TIED UP IN THE STABLES, CAMPING AND COMPETITION AREAS. Dogs may be exercised in the off-leash area at the southern end of the park. Pick up after your dog.

FEI General Regulations Article 109.13: Violation of this rule will incur a fine of \$150 per offence, and in the case of a repeated offence, may lead to exclusion from the venue.

There is NO ENTRY into the stable block between 10 pm and 6am (11pm on XC Night) as per FEI Rules. Exemption will be given to those with Veterinary Permission and in this case the FEI Stable Steward (Jo Crosby) must be contacted first.

ENTRY RIGHT TO GROUNDS

ALLOCATED TICKETS (accreditation)

Two systems of accreditation will be operating as all three days of the 5* competition will be ticketed.

Competition Accreditation (wristbands) will be allocated as detailed below.

A General Admission ticket or an AEF wristband will be required for access to the Main Arena on Friday, Saturday and Sunday; and to all three parks on Cross Country Day.

AEF Wristbands will be allocated to each competitor as follows:

Rider 1

Groom 1 per athlete (rider)

Partner 0

Horse Owners 2 as per FEI passport

These wristbands will provide access to the GA areas within the event venue, as well as the stables. They do not provide access to the grandstand, Giddy Up Club or VIP Lounge.

Extra passes may be purchased from the Secretary's office for \$50 each.

THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO

CAMP SITE/STABLE AREA – ENTER OFF WAKEFIELD RD

PLEASE NOTE: This year, the campsite is situated on the bitumen pad in the middle of Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi (west of the Main Arena). Pegging of annexes is not possible into bitumen. Please bring weights to weigh your annexes down.

Powered camping facilities are available in Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi. There will be a compound erected for trucks and caravans. Shower/toilet facilities will be on site. Truck identification numbers will be allocated and campers must park at the corresponding campsite. Fines will be issued to those who do not park in their allocated space. Only those vehicles displaying the Camp Site permit will be granted access to this area. Additional vehicles may be parked in the volunteer's car park off Fullarton Road

Competitors are advised that the campsite will be audited by officers of Workplace Services who will be inspecting all electrical cables and appliances to ensure that they carry a valid safety tag. Any qualified electrician can test and tag your cables and appliances.

We recommend you ensure your cables and appliances are tested and tagged prior to the event, otherwise they will be removed.

The total facilities fee including camping fee at Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi will be \$350 per vehicle for Tuesday - Sunday. Riders not camping onsite must pay a \$50 amenities fee.

A food truck will be situated within the stable area, and there are eating outlets within the Event venue in Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi. There are also many cafes in the surrounding areas of Norwood Parade and East End Adelaide.



IN CASE OF EMERGENCEY

In the unlikely case of an emergency, see emergency evacuation map which is posted in the Secretary's office as well as all notice boards in the stable area and campground areas.

ADVERTISING & PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES & HORSES

The athletes <u>are authorised</u> to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with Article 541 of the FEI Rules for Eventing. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on athletes and horse complies with these Articles.

BIOSECURITY

Movement of horses

There are currently no movement requirements or certification required for horses moving from interstate into SA. However, **please be advised that we are a HENDRA event**. Livestock (including horses) affected or suspected of being affected with a notifiable disease may not enter the State unless authorised by the SA Chief Inspector of Stock.

NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Hendra Vaccination

Riders are required to advise the Hendra vaccination status of their horses on their entry form. The organising committee reserves the right to not accept entries where horses from Hendra-affected areas* are not vaccinated.

Hay & Fodder:

THERE IS TO BE NO HAY BROUGHT INTO SA FROM INTERSTATE. If you need to bring in your own hay then this will need to be inspected on arrival at the AEF venue by Biosecurity SA. This inspection WILL INCUR A FEE of \$159.

Hay brought into SA from interstate must be securely wrapped upon arrival, separated by one metre from other plant materials, and subjected to a Direct Inspection by a Biosecurity SA Officer before being released. These checks cannot be carried out at the border. Charges will apply.

It is highly recommended that you purchase your feed and hay through Oliver's to be delivered to the AEF on your arrival.

1. Medical Information Form for Armbands

Declaration of medical condition

Athletes with medical conditions that may be relevant in the case of a medical emergency are responsible, at every Event when riding, for wearing a medical data carrier* from a system provider able to communicate information at least in English. Alternatively (and at the minimum) a medical armband of good quality can be used. Athletes who chose to wear an armband should download and fill the form available for this purpose on the FEI's website http://www.fei.org/fei/your-role/officials/eventing/forms.

2. Insurances and National Requirements

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the FEI Event Organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses at or in connection with an FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability. The FEI and the Organiser will **NOT** be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

3. Protests/Appeals

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

4. Disputes

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

5. Event's Organisation (Art. 109 - 110)

The OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. All modifications made to the schedule must have the approval of the FEI Secretary General.

STEWARDING

It is the rider's responsibility to be aware of the FEI rules under which the event is being run. If riders are uncertain about any rules, such as if the equipment/gear they are using is approved, then they should approach the Stewarding Team.

HUMAN ANTI- DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in article 22.3 of the FEI's Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA). The ADRHA rules are published on the FEI's website at http://fei.org/content/anti-doping-rules.

VETERINARY MATTERS

Veterinary Regulations (VRs), 14th edition, updates effective 1st January 2019

Examination on Arrival

FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1031

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

Temperature Information-

FEI Veterinay Regulations Article 1031

Prior to arrival ensure an FEI Equine Health Self-Certification form has been completed in the FEI HorseApp for each Horse entering the FEI Stables Area and that the Horse's rectal temperature has been recorded in the FEI HorseApp twice daily for **3 days prior to the <u>first horse</u> arriving** at the event (ie 3 days prior to Tuesday April 16 April). Other methods of evaluating the Horse's body temperature must be FEI approved.

As horses will be arriving at the AEF from Tuesday, all competitors will be required to start recording their horses temperature and entering it into the FEI HorseApp from Saturday 15 April.

Any companion horse or non-competing horse that has to enter the stables must have their temp taken upon arrival. Hese horse cannot enter the stables without PRIOR approval from the stable manager.

ICE/SHAVINGS

Ice will be available to purchase throughout the event from the Secretary's Office at \$6 per bag. EFTPOS facilities are available.

Alternatively, ice can be purchased from the Britannia Hotel or the Shell Service Station, opposite the Main Entry Gates.

Shavings can be both preordered with entry on Nominate and also purchased throughout the event from the Secretary's Office. \$15 per bale. EFTPOS facilities are available.
